


Research Corner: Factors Impacting Provider Retention

In the study titled "Perspectives of Early Intervention Program Directors on Provider Retention Efforts" by Yeager, Argus-Calvo, Mangadu, Thimbriel, and Chaib Lozano (2023), researchers investigated the ongoing national shortage of early intervention providers for children with disabilities and developmental delays. The researchers were interested in understanding factors that affect early intervention providers' retention, which refers to minimizing turnover and the ability to keep qualified workers in their roles.

The study involved in-depth interviews with 27 program directors and identified twelve themes across four main categories affecting provider retention: compensation and financial incentives, program management and organization, positive climate and culture, and training and mentoring. The findings emphasize the need for effective strategies to improve retention efforts, which are essential for maintaining quality services in early intervention programs. This research contributes to the understanding of factors influencing provider turnover and offers implications for enhancing the workforce in early intervention settings.
